Balsam Fir

Blue Spruce

Distinctive bluish tint, long lasting with strong branches for heavy ornaments.

White Pine

Soft appearance with bluish tint and good needle retention. Muted aroma - good for those with allergies.

Concolor Fir

Excellent natural shape with silver-green, aromatic needles.

Douglas Fir

Soft to the touch with blue-green, aromatic needles.

Getting Ready for Winter

Cut Trees: Selection and Care

Following are a few hints to help you select that perfect tree:

- Decide where you will place the tree. Be sure to choose a spot away from heat sources, such as TVs, fireplaces, radiators and air ducts. Place the tree clear of doors.
- Measure the height and width of the space you have available in the room where the tree will be placed. There is nothing worse than bringing a tree indoors only to find it's too tall. Take a tape measure with you to measure your chosen tree.
- Choose a fresh tree. A fresh tree will have a healthy green appearance with few browning needles. Needles should be flexible and not fall off if you run a branch through your hand. Raise the tree a few inches off the ground and drop it on the butt end. Very few green needles should drop off the tree. It is normal for a few inner brown needles to drop off.
- Remember to choose a tree that fits where it is to be displayed. For example if the tree is displayed in front of a large window, then all four sides should look as good as possible. If the tree is displayed against a wall, then a tree with three good sides would be okay. A tree with two good sides would work well in a corner.
- Make sure the handle or base of the tree is straight and 6-8 inches long so it will fit easily into the stand.
